The minutes of the Fall Workshop were read and accepted. A copy of these should have been mailed to you from the Area Registrar.

### **Delegate Report**

Jodi gave her final report as delegate and, as usual, it was complete and concise. A major event, which just came on the radar, is a Grapevine Forum being put on by GSO at the Fall Assembly in September. Other areas may be invited to attend this event.

A contest was started to provide a name and a theme for this event. Full details in a flyer that she passed out. Copies will be made available for those who wish to participate.

Report from the Fall Workshop shows that 69 people attended. 58 lunches were served and 657 years of sobriety were counted. \$775 returned to the Area. Mitch reported.

Janet reported on the Pre-Conference event. Held in Washington at the 'same old place'. There will be roundtables Friday night for all who wish to attend.

Ken did his usual for the upcoming PRAASA being held in Tucson. He may be a great Treasurer but he is one very pale Mexican. Even in his sombrero and Poncho Villa mustache. PRAASA will be held March 13-15 this year.

Graham proposed that the Area hold a Bridging the gap workshop in June. There is a gap in the service functions during this time period and is ideal for getting people together for CPC and Treatment work. As this was not a voting assembly, all we could do was accept the motion and report back to the District body how important it is to take this to your groups for discussion. Bridging the Gap is an important part of the service work we provide to those leaving Treatment and confinement. Discuss the possibilities of this workshop with your group and be prepared to vote on it at the Pre-Conference Assembly. If we hurry, we may be able to hold one in 2005. Financial impact was reported as insignificant as only seed money will be needed for this event.

Graham also presented a motion that the Area Literature Chair 'own' the distribution and publishing responsibility for 'So you have been told to go to AA and you hate the idea'. Motion accepted.

Jodi announced that the theme for 2005 will be discussed at the Pre-Conference Assembly. Each year, we task our delegate to take our ideas for yearly themes back to GSO. As in the past, our suggestions count. It is wise to ask your groups about the message we want to pass on and present your findings at this Pre-Conf Assembly.

John Mc. Presented the idea that there be a Meditations meeting and DCM roundtables slated for each Area function. Rather than make a formal motion, it was suggested that the event chairperson for each event be contacted to include these additions to the schedule, as time permits.

As chairperson for the next event, Area Committee meeting, I am willing to support both a meditations meeting and a roundtable for DCMs. I need willing AA's to help plan and coordinate these additional events.

Mike and Alberto presented the idea that a new District be formed for the Spanish-speaking groups. Much discussion ensued about this proposal regarding structure, geographics, cost to Area and potential hazards of this proposal. Take this to your groups for their conscience on this matter.
