District 2 GSR Meeting Minutes

Pete G. chaired the August GSR Meeting.

Doug R. took the meeting minutes.

The meeting opened with a moment of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer.

The GSR Preamble was read.

The Responsibility declaration was read.

Concept 8 was read, tradition 8 was read and Pete gave a dissertation on its meaning and origin.

We went around the room introducing ourselves.

James presented the Treasurer's report. A concern was raised as to why the DCM Rent was way over budget. It was explained that this budget was created when we held the meetings at Fellowship Hall, the new budget will reflect the current expenses. The Treasurer's report was approved as read.

Michaelene R, the Chair for the 2006 Post-Conference Host Committee gave her report. The first meeting of this committee will be held September 10, 2005 2:00pm at the Holiday Inn, 999 South Main, SLC.

Three Standing Committee Chairs gave their reports.

The Correction's "Pink Can" fund raising effort has raised nearly \$600.00 so far. A lot of literature has been bought and distributed. The inmates are grateful.

The literature Chair asked if you know of any literature racks that are not being filled to please let her know.

The Newsletter Chair pointed out that there are 217 people signed up to receive the newsletter via email. He pointed out some of the articles in the current issue. The information that will be voted on at the September Fall Assembly is contained in the August issue.

In old business the election of Alt-DCMs for sub-district A and E were discussed. Jay N. stood for and was unanimously accepted as one of the Alt-DCMs, the DCMC will determine which one would be most appropriate for him to take.

The District 2 workshop was discussed. New topics were brought to the table. The topic of "The 12 Concepts" was agreed upon by a substantial majority. Sara N. volunteered to Chair the event. The GSR body decided to hold this event Saturday, October 22, 2005.

Vacant service positions were announced as new business. 2 Standing Committee Chairs are needed; PI/CPC and Grapevine. Recording Secretary. DCM for sub-district A. And 2 Alt-DCMs, one for sub-district B and one for sub-district F.

Janet W. stood for the Alt-DCM position for sub-district B, unanimously accepted by the GSR body.

The formation of a Budget Committee was discussed by the District's Treasurer. Even though the budget will be based on last years it was suggested that the Standing Chairs submit any additional requests for funding. The committee was formed with the following volunteers. James H., Pete G., Jim D., Callene H. and Sara N.

The Chair read the proposed changes to the Area guidelines, questions were answered as best they could. It was suggested that if you or your group members have questions regarding these proposed changes to contact the Chair of the Guidelines Review Committee Jodi E.

The 2 Area motions were also read.

Any questions on these items should be directed to your DCMs, who will contact the appropriate Area contact to help answer them.

The meeting adjourned at 8:16 pm.

Originally meeting two nights a week plus Sunday morning, this group has tried going to a non-smoking format or potluck speaker meetings but to no avail. Members from outside the community and from within Grantsville still strive to find the schedule that will work, but attendance is sporadic.

The 17th and 17th 12 by 12 is AA in action. Meeting Saturday mornings in the friendly atmosphere of the church where we hold our GSR meetings, this meeting can be very spiritual. It is also humble and I like that. It is obvious that this group of alcoholics meet to share what they have with the newcomer. If you are out and about on Saturday morning, stop by and start the day in a very spiritual manner.

The City at Seven group is a powerful messenger of recovery. Meeting in a multi-purpose room, this group has one of the widest variety of ages attending and also the chemistry that speaks of recovery. I attended a meeting, which elected a new group secretary for the upcoming two years, and it was fantastic to see the Traditions in action. Other meetings provided both encouragement to the newcomer and a spirit of oneness that gives the newcomer hope.

One of the most diverse groups in this sub-district is the New Way group (Uni). Most people have attended the Sunday 'birthday' meeting and seen the awesome number of alcoholics attending each Sunday. Most alcoholics with any time in the program should attend the Thursday night meetings to aid those who still suffer in a more closed setting. Of the times I have attended on Thursday evenings, the newcomers outnumber the alcoholics packing metal by a substantial margin. If you really want to be grateful for your freedom and want to carry the message to newcom-

ers, I suggest Thursday nights at Uni. You will be rewarded for your efforts.

Of the other groups that comprise this sub-district, I have little one-on-one knowledge. I do know that the Friendship group meets regularly on Saturdays and helps the newcomer. I have little knowledge of the Sizzlin Sobriety hour but I can't wait for the opportunity. Attending these groups has taught me one thing, I am there to learn and assist where I can. As guardians of the traditions, it is important to remember that gives us the opportunity to learn and to teach where we can, not to govern or judge. I must never forget that these groups have served the newcomer for many days and to try to institute changes is foolhardy. To aid growth is our mission, as I understand it.

Fall Assembly 2005

My name is Pete and I am an alcoholic. It is my privilege to serve as the DCM for sub-district C of District 2 in Area 69. I attended the Fall Assembly on the Utah State University campus in Logan this past weekend. I can safely say that things will never be the same in Area 69 or in District 2 again. We were allowed to grow into a little history this past weekend.

As you know, this event was combined with the Grapevine and LaViña magazines in addition to our regular Assembly business. It turned out well but it was action-packed. Truly in this event, if you snooze – you loose. The District 1 host committee and the Area Officers should be commended for this excellent event. To those who attended this event, the cost was not prohibitive and the event center was excellent. Our visiting servants from the Grapevine and LaViña were enthusiastic and humble. Our Regional Trustee was in attendance and aided Area 69 in conducting nominations for Regional Trustee.

Here is my report; I hope that anything I missed will be added to by the other attendees.

Friday Night in a college town. The host committee should be commended for the accurate instructions relating to the event. The big red sign saying "AREA 69" didn't hurt either. Traveling with other trusted servants of the District, our first indication that this event would be special was delivered in the form of Jim and Mickey H. meeting us in the hotel parking lot. To those who are new to service, Jim H. was elected to serve as Area Treatment chair last year but had to resign due to ill health. To see him at this event was a blessing, as his knowledge and enthusiasm was sorely missed in his absence.

The Friday night 'Grapeball' meeting was interesting. The

meeting opened with the chairperson tossing a purple beachball to a member and having them share on their experience with the Grapevine. The ball was tossed to the next 'lucky' speaker. Our very own Walter was the only one drilled by the beachball but there were no lasting bruises or contusions. It was a fun way to start.

The speaker meeting that evening was a gentleman who serves as the editor of the LaViña magazine. How appropriate for the events that were to take place the following day. This speaker meeting also used an English-to-Spanish translator, utilizing headphones for those who wished translation. Not that Hernan, the speaker, could not have translated himself. He is originally from South America and is fluent in Spanish. His story was excellent and was testimony to the various ways we make it to the program, and then pay back what we can by serving in various capacities.

Also speaking this evening was Mike P, Chairman of the Board of Directors for the Grapevine. His information was excellent for learning to use the Grapevine as a tool for enhancing sobriety. Some ideas for use included using the GV as a unifying tool in meetings, treatment centers and corrections institutes. The magazine can aid in telephone technique. It reminded us to not take ourselves too seriously. The magazine included a Spanish-speaking section until 1996 and then the LaViña was published as a separate magazine of it's own. Today, there are 9500 subscriptions to LaViña.

Saturday....

Julie S. – Area Chairperson – opened the meeting with two special announcements. First – this Assembly was being translated into Spanish for those attending who could not understand English. Second was that the Area minutes from this

event could be Emailed to your Email account for easy and cheaper retrieval.

In attendance were 5 past delegates, the LaViña editor, director of the board for the Grapevine, our regional trustee, a delegate from California, a past delegate from Wyoming and translators (w/equipment) from California.

Joanne G. – Area Secretary – read minutes from the past event.

Sherri P. – Area 69 Treasurer gave the financial report. Approved and accepted.

Sherri also presented the budget for 2006. Primary changes were

- \$500 additional for the Administrative budget.
- \$55 for Archives (additional storage fees)
- \$500 for BTG workshop
- \$200 increase for the delegate donations for conference attendance.
- \$100 for P. I. Budget to cover website expenses.
- \$1800 for Area officers to attend regional Forum

These items were approved in a line-by-line vote.

Additional monies were earmarked for literature (\$100) but no increase was necessary.

A motion to decrease the Newsletter budget by \$200 was made and seconded. The Newsletter only spent 350 last year and the 'extra' money is to be distributed in the following manner. \$50 each was added to P.I., Treatment, Corrections and CPC. Motion carried.

District 10 was the sole bidder for the 2007 Fall Assembly. They will host this event.

Delegate Report – Mike O. Mike is having a change of life. He will be retiring in December. This will allow him to devote more time to Area visits and business. His recent activities include visits to District 10

business meetings, District 3's Whoopee Party and other activities. He noted that two Central Offices were destroyed by Katrina and that the donations so far had replaced the material destroyed. All additional donations will go to help the AA's being housed at Camp Williams. Keep those donations coming.

District Reports.

District 1 – Eddie (host district) reports sending their Treatment chair to BTG. Their secretary resigned and that position was filled by a DCM stepping into that position. He reports a lot of good fellowship while preparing for this event.

District 2 – Thom. Reports District Openings for DCM's, Alt DCM's, Grapevine and Secretary. He reported recent success in getting AA meetings back in the VOA. He reported the District workshop based on Demystifying the Concepts.

District 3 – Mitch reporting for John. Good Old Fashioned Whoopee party gathered \$1266 for the Central Office in Provo. They held a service workshop. District 4 and 5 were not represented.

District 6 – Leroy reports having some service positions open. Having a Fall Workshop on Nov 19.

District 7 – Steve reports having a District inventory. All positions filled and \$\$\$ ok.

District 8 – Nadine holding Area Fall Workshop Nov 4 and 5. Make reservations early as the area employment boom has made hotels scarce.

District 9 – no report

District 10 – Andy reports completing their budget for 2006. They rotate 5 DCM's and alternates yearly and this was successful.

Spanish-Speaking Sub district reports holding weekly meetings and are active with court referrals.

District 11 – Adrian reports for Gary. Reports Pre-Assembly workshops was a fun success. They have formed an ad hoc committee for the 2007 Post-Conference. They are financially solvent and have a prudent reserve.

Standing Chair reports. Monte – Assemblies. Area will be holding two special events. A BTG workshop in Price in June 2006 and the National BTG conference in SLC next year. Announced this special assembly is being translated and is attended by the editorial board of the Grapevine and LaViña.

Archives – Janet. National Archives meeting in Louisiana were cancelled due to Katrina and re-scheduled for early next year.

CPC – Mike was climbing Mt. Everest.

Corrections – Richard. Attended the National BTG conference in St. Josephs Missouri. Learned how to share resources and to simplify efforts. Has received 5 applications for temporary sponsors and needs more.

Literature – Grahmae. Has Area newcomer's packet. Attended National BTG conference also. Sending local literature to national next year.

Grapevine – John M. has an assistant to do LaViña, Adrian from District 11.

Newsletter – Ruth. Moved to southern Utah. Has new computer to help her organize.

Asks that we use website whenever possible, especially for new address.

P.I. – Leann. Helping with hurricane evacuees. She reports enough Big Books and 12 X 12's for now.

Website had 10413 hits in 18 months. Website paid until March 2007.

Area Chairperson to appoint someone to fill vacancy after considering input from current area officers. (There was a substantial unanimity on this motion but it wasn't unanimous.

States that ad hoc committees should include one or more GSR's.

Checking account (Area) to have a signature card signed by Area Treasurer, Area Chair and Area Recording Secretary.

Allows the Immediate Past Delegate to serve as Co-Chair of the Guidelines Committee.

Allows the Newsletter to be distributed in even years at either the Fall Workshop or the Dec. Area Committee meeting/Pass the Gavel meeting – at Newsletters discretion.

PI Standing Chairperson to serve as the chair of the Area Web Committee.

Allows the Area elections to be conducted by the Regional Trustee, whenever possible. If not possible, the current or a past delegate may conduct.

Allows no outside contributions to the Area or contri-

butions exceeding the current amount accepted by GSO.

Requests report of Guidelines committee at the Fall Assembly in odd years and Post Conference Assembly in even years. Amended to include the Area Assembly Chairperson as part of the committee.

Defines the guidelines for the Area website, including web servant. See Appendix E or Area web site for details.

Regional Trustee Nominations – Phyllis H.

Our past delegates – Jodi E., Shirley O., Rod B., and Mickey H. were willing and able to stand for this position.
